Dear Mr. Williams,

I'm pleased to inform you of the Palm City Chamber of Commerce's support for the Floridian Natural Gas Storage Company's plan to build a liquefied natural gas storage facility in neighboring Indiantown. After a complete examination of the issues involved — safety, economics and environmental impact — we feel confident that your project represents a wise move for the region and the right fit for this area of Martin County.

To your credit you've openly addressed concerns, fielded all manner of questions and given comprehensive descriptions and diagrams of the structure's safety mechanisms.

In the short term, the project promises a surge to our local economy by offering a variety of skilled construction jobs to area residents. Over the longer term, your project means more electricity supply security for local businesses and homeowners as well as offering a way to regulate energy costs.

There's also a reoccurring economic advantage. Martin County's tax base will enjoy a substantial increase of \$1.5 million or more annually once the project is fully completed.

The proposed location, already an ideal fit due to its industrial zoning and proximity to existing pipelines, presents even more appeal. Your proposed re-use of the Florida Steel Superfund site is significantly more attractive than many of the alternative re-uses allowed by the EPA.
